MEDICAL POLICIES

Crowders Camps does not provide on-site medical care. Our staff are trained in CPR and basic first aid. We do have AED's on site. By signing our camp participation form, parents understand that medical care will be given in good faith by our staff and/or emergency personnel should an emergency arise.

MEDICATION

All medication must be self-administered by the camper, with assistance from our staff. Any medication should be communicated in advance and come to camp in its original packaging. Crowders Camps does not maintain a dispensary and is not able to administer medication that is not sent with the camper.

ENVIRONMENTAL (BEESTINGS, DUST, POLLEN, ETC) ALLERGIES

Allergies should be communicated in advance on the camp participation form.

FOOD ALLERGIES

Each parent has the option to sign up for a gluten free meal plan for your camper for a small additional charge (\$15 for the entire camp week, used for additional food purchases and preparation). Our kitchen is a peanut, tree-nut, and shell fish free facility. Any additional food allergies must be accommodated by each parent. We have a fridge and freezer available to store supplemental food.
